1949	Flag Day Observance
1963	Barry Bishop places U.S. Flag on Mt. Everest
1969	Neil Armstrong places U.S. Flag on the moon
1999	Amendment hearing to prohibit physical desecration of flag
2000	U.S. Flag Day Proclamation by President W. Clinton
