## Final Phase of the Library's Print Periodical Survey

In Spring 2008, Library Services initiated a systematic review of print journal holdings available at Minnesota State Mankato. Faculty members in the College of Arts & Humanities and the College of Science, Engineering & Technology are currently being surveyed to seek input on what kind of access to journal information works best for their discipline. For example, programs with a strong online component may prefer electronic access. For journals with art reproductions, photographs or charts, paper might be a better alternative. In some instances, paying for document delivery might be a better choice than subscribing to a high-cost, specialized journal that receives little use on campus.

In the past decade the number of resources, especially online, has increased dramatically. At the same time, courses and programs offered by departments and programs have gone through significant changes. Additionally, during the recent 10% budget reduction, the Library saw an approximate \$250,000 reduction in the base budget for materials, which had an impact on journal subscriptions. Consequently, it is important for the Library to complete the journals analysis to determine their relationship to the curriculum.

The Library is grateful to the faculty members from the Colleges of Education, Business, Allied Health & Nursing and Social & Behavioral Sciences who responded to the survey in 2008 and 2009. The review project is slated to conclude this spring with the review of the journal titles that support the College of Arts & Humanities and the College of Science, Engineering & Technology. 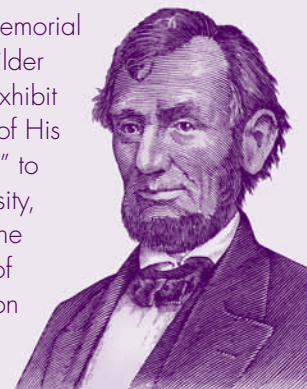
