
- A presentation is a form of teaching.

Check in with audience-Highs and Lows. How are you today? What "baggage are you bringing with you? What do you know about these factors of self?




The one thing that changes everything; How do you know whom to trust? How do you become competent?






You are making decisions and acting in each of these domains-often unconsciously. How do you make this conscious? How can you move to the metacognitive domain for your audience?




What do you know about Vygotsky?


Piaget-Sensori-motor; pre-operational; concrete operations, formal operations




Lower levels of understanding-prior knowledge....how do you know where your audience is?
Self-assessments, informal assessments, LIST STORM


