Leadership Synthesis

The process of developing my leadership competency has been dynamic in the aspects it encompasses. Across coursework, I have been able to learn theories of leadership while putting my own previous knowledge to the test. Through this process, I have unearthed different leadership styles and embodied those that are consistent with my core values. With these experiences, I have identified 3 stages in developing my leadership competency: opportunity, enlightenment, application. This timeline has allowed me to grow continuously within the competency.

Initially, for the opportunity stage of my personal leadership development, I joined the Honors Learning Community. Within in this group, we identified our personal values and used those to pinpoint our roles within the group. I discovered I valued accountability, success, and respect in leaders. In addition, this group helped me recognize and acknowledge my extroversion and competitiveness as positive traits that can be utilized into my leadership style. Following the opportunity stage, I quickly transitioned into my enlightenment stage where I dove into leadership philosophy and the meaning behind my own ideals and values. I started my journey by partaking in a Mentorship Philosophy Course where the class would explore the various philosophies behind leadership and its evolution throughout time. I then completed a course where we Explored Our Personal Leadership. I was able to critique real-world leadership philosophies and group dynamics in an effort to better understand effective styles of leadership. This experience allowed me to ground myself to the situational style of leadership, where leaders adapt to the people they lead and the situation at hand. Both of these courses helped my reflect upon my personal values and prepared me to apply my findings to my life.

Finally, it was time for me to apply my knowledge into real leadership roles. As the Sales Director for my Integrated Business Experience (IBE), I learned that the situational style of leadership is one to be further pursued due to its universal relevance and ability to adapt with different teams. Furthermore, with my acceptance of a Management Internship with Menards, I developed my situational style of leadership and focused on some constants that have maintained significance in my personal leadership philosophy. Some of those constants successful leaders maintain include empathy, trust, and deep connections with their team no matter the situation. Finally, my involvement as a Learning Community Coordinator allowed me to not only see my strengths but also my weaknesses', specifically in time management and coordination. I was forced to grow in these areas and became a better leader from it.

Research Synthesis

When I entered college with the intent to graduate as a business professional, I did not expect to complete any relevant research to my major and field of study. However, as time progressed, I quickly realized that research is conducted in many roles within business. Throughout my time here at MSU, I have learned that the purpose of research is to advance knowledge in any given field by combining existing knowledge with original, newly found information backed by trusted processes. My insight and development have grown tremendously in this competency while maintaining focus on my future in the field of business.

To embark upon my research journey at college, I completed research coursework in my Honors FYEX class. We looked into where to find credible sources and why ethical sourcing and written material is crucial to progressive research. I then incorporated my thoughts in research reports I completed in my Biology

Course. I conducted research on my sources to make sure they were credible and reliable, then used those sources to develop my own ideas. It was important to me that I came across as a credible author, so I chose sources that were appropriate to my thesis. This fundamental aspect of ethical work has become a commonality to all the research I will conduct in the future.

In my next encounter with research, I participated in a Community Engagement Project where our mission was to promote social change within the local Mankato area. We worked with a local food bank, ECHO, and concluded that use of performance reports on mandatory volunteers can quell some negative feedback associated with required volunteering, such as disengaged workers and poor customer experiences. In our research process, we incorporated our observations with credible backing to promote real change in our community. I then built upon this experience when I completed a Philosophy Research Paper where I compare and contrast Utilitarianism vs. Relativism. I explored numerous philosophers' viewpoints and incorporated their thoughts into my own thesis and paper. I then made the connection that organization is key to the research process. Seeing the organization of the philosopher's original work helped me understand how they conveyed their intelligence to others and thus I used a similar framework to convey my thoughts. Parallel to this project, I conducted research on the country of Belize. I utilized numerous sources that allowed me to create a credible and up-to-date Country Report that future students could utilize. This would not be possible without ethical research practices and cohesive synthesis of sources for thesis development.

As my skills developed over time, I decided to take part in original research that relates to my field in the Integrated Business Experience (IBE) program. I joined the marketing team and completed original market research where we identified what product we wanted to sell. We then comprised a survey asking questions that would narrow down our target market. As a team, we struggled to come up with adequate questions to decipher our target market. However, with some help from our professors, we were able to make a concise and positive survey that would supply us with sufficient information. After spreading our survey around, we concluded our research and devised charts and graphs to easily disseminate our results. We then presented our findings to investment bankers who held vast knowledge in the field. We received positive feedback but also our fair share of constructive criticism. After some long nights and exhaustive additional research and learning from our mistakes, we were able to receive our loan from the investment bankers. This application of original business-related research was incredibly beneficial to my knowledge in the research process.

To say personal growth has happened throughout my college career is an understatement. With the experiences I have encountered, my confidence in conducting research has grown exponentially and I do not plan to stop after I receive my degree. My skills in this area translate to a wide variety of teams across the business spectrum. When learning can translate to application, amazing work can be done. I am excited to continue and grow as my professional career take off!

Global Citizenship Synthesis

An individual that embodies the concept of Global Citizenship is one who is aware of their own culture, knows and understands different cultural perspectives, and actively tries to communicate with others. Before joining the Honors Program, this concept was not present in my life. However, the past 3 and a half years have prompted me to grow through different experiences within this competency.

To become a Global Citizen, one must be aware of their own culture to obtain the ability to decipher others. Within my Honors First Year Seminar course (FYEX), my classmates and I reflected upon our own culture and how that looks different for each of us. Furthermore, I participated in viewing Immigrant Stories and how their cultures morphed with their new communities.
