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RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE HIGH SCHOOL/COLLEGE  
CONNECTION IN INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

1. Research into actual interaction between high school and colleges, especially if we are researching urban high schools.
2. Connection should not be one way nor just related to recruiting. Colleges should be "good neighbors."
3. Many changes are occurring on the interscholastic level that colleges must be aware of. It is vital to communicate to high schools.
4. Events should have common descriptions for each event and criteria for judging them.
5. Renewed emphasis should be placed on trying to bring high school associations back into the Council of Forensic Organizations.
6. College communication departments should develop courses/workshops for high school forensic teachers.
7. College forensic people should become involved in state associations, federations, and/or leagues to develop connections. Contacts should not just

be at contests.

- 8 Recruiting is still a concern. Should recruiting codes exist? Should a national collegiate group develop such a code?
9. Discussed institutes. They are important, but no specific recommendations were made.
